## **DANIEL SMITH Interactive Color Map (CIE Lab)**

From the homepage at DanielSmith.com, go to the Resources menu and click on Color map.

Hover on any color block to see its name, then click on the block for a pop-up window with more details.

You can add the colors you pick one-by one to the Compare Bar to review later.

Visit the Help Menu on the far right to read more about the Compare Bar, which allows you to see your color selections side by side by clicking the Compare button.

You can email or download your color selections from the Compare Bar by clicking these buttons at the upper right.

The Help Menu also tells you how to zoom is closer and scroll from left to right on areas of the map where the colors are very close together.

There are also many ways to search and filter colors in groups, rather than individually.

Click the Search button and type in a whole or partial color name to find it on the map. See how many results you get here. You can add up to 20 colors at a time to the compare bar.

Click on any color from here to read the Color Story and see more details like a video and side-by side swatches.

Go back to the Search menu to clear your selections at the upper right, then start a new search.

Try sliding the Brightness bar to look at a range of colors by their brightness.

Choose as many filters as you like to see colors grouped by the characteristics they share. View your results on the map, highlighted in yellow, or click Compare to see them larger, side by side.

You can also see colors grouped by family...

Or see just the colors on our Brand Ambassadors' Dot Cards...

Or look at just single pigment colors. Pick them out one by one or see all of them together, then filter them down further by characteristic if you want.

Use this button to switch between a 2-dimensional (or flat) map and a rotating 3-dimensional map. Use this button at the bottom to stop and start the rotation.

Change the map's background color (for either 2D or 3D mode) from white to black to gray.
